Marsha has served the citizens of Oregon for 32 years and has a background in information technology and regulatory program management. As the Standards and Certification Manager, Marsha's goal has been to achieve compliance with the laws and rules through education and assistance. This is being accomplished through statewide outreach, providing access to certification-related information to all public safety administrators and personnel, and updating the public safety community with changes to the requirements of DPSST's public safety certifications.

Noteworthy accomplishments over her 22 years at the Department include implementation of the Snapshot/IRIS program, streamlining certification processing and issuance, conducting workgroups related to legislative changes or policy committee requests, implementing rule changes, ensuring the public safety community is aware of and understands any new or updated requirements.
