Pendleton Underground Tours Submerge to a trip back to Pendleton's wild past through underground tunnels where Chinese laborers lived and businesses thrived. Oh the tales those walls could tell! 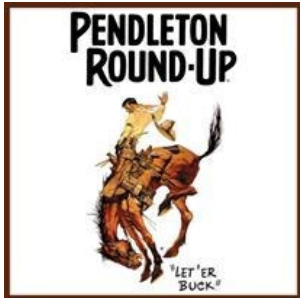

Tamastlikt Cultural Institute This state of the art interpretive center located next to Wildhorse Resort and Casino features awe-inspiring permanent and temporary exhibits. The exhibits present the story of westward expansion from the perspective of the Umatilla, Cayuse and Walla Walla Tribes. Since you're there, you should also visit the retail gift shop and stop in the Kinship Café for a piece of fresh huckleberry pie or a huckleberry cinnamon roll!



Round Up & Happy Canyon Hall of Fame Finally, no stop to Pendleton would be complete until you have visited what Pendleton is world famous for! Feel the excitement of over 100 years of rodeo and pageant tradition. See the people, livestock and personalities that have built Pendleton's signature week-long event, bringing our population from 17,000 to over 50,000. Tours are self guided and are free.
